In Whiterocks the coming of July means it's time for the Arts-Kids & Arts-Teens Summer Camp. This has become a high point for local families, and with lots of new kids attending this year it was even more energetic. They enjoyed working with visiting artists to make their own journals, a watercolor/mixed media project called "An Ocean of Emotions," as well as drawings and collages

following up on our field trip to Dinosaur National Monument. The teens also made expressive Wrap-Dolls and created their own 'Zines, narratives illustrated with drawings and photos printed from their cell phones.

After finishing their daily art work the kids looked forward to playing games outside—kickball and volleyball were especially popular.

## Arts-Teens on the Road

It was a great experience for the youth of St. Elizabeth's, Whiterocks to go on a road trip. They'd just shared a wonderful week of Summer Camp with the Arts-Kids back home, including some special projects just for the teenagers. They'd worked with visiting artists to make unique and expressive Wrap-Dolls, created personal journals, and wrote

their own 'Zines, narratives illustrated by drawings and photos printed from their cell phones.

Two days later the Arts-Teens group (eight young women and three adults) headed for Salt Lake to

Twice-daily Talking Circles are central to the Arts-Kids process: we gather to check in with each other, set and review our intentions, and recall the behavior guidelines the kids created on the first day. It's powerful to hear children say, "My intention is to be creative..." or "to try something new..." or "to stay in control..." or simply "to have fun."

At the heart of the Arts-Kids leadership are the Facilitators, six Native women who serve as companions and guides for the young

people. Thanks to them the program cultivates intergenerational relationships, a traditional value in our community. We were blessed by a new collaboration this year between St. Elizabeth's and Holy Spirit Church in Randlett, which brought us new leaders and new kids. We look forward to our Fall Series, six meetings on Wednesday afternoons beginning on September 20.

stay at the Episcopal Church Center for two nights. We gathered twice a day in a Talking Circle to check in and set our intentions, before enjoying a variety of activities. We visited the Native Voices exhibit at the Natural History Museum, after which Facilitator Raycita Quinn tearfully recalled “the pride these girls had at seeing their own people being honored.” We spent an energetic evening at Valley Fair Mall, had breakfast with Bishop Hayashi, walked the labyrinth, and sat silently in the Cathedral writing and drawing in our journals.

Everyone agreed that the high point of the trip came in the last two hours, when we volunteered at Hildegard’s Food Pantry next door to the Cathedral. We raced to keep up with the stream of clients, some of us boxing up the food they chose while the others restocked the shelves. Being able to help people meet such a basic need was transforming for the teenagers. One of the girls summed up their comments: “Going to the food pantry made me thankful for everything I have.” I can’t wait to see what will come next for them on this path of serving others!

## Bishop's Committee Begins Again

When the Bishop's Committee lacked membership, I met regularly with Wardens Greg Quinn and Carleen Kurip. One day Greg said he thought it was time to get the committee going again, and each of us found someone willing to join. At its first meeting on June 25 the committee agreed on terms for current members, with the understanding that two people will be elected at the beginning of each year. Carleen will serve until next January, Greg and Forrest Cuch until 2019, and Kathleen Chegup and Raycita Quinn until the beginning of 2020.

So far the Bishop's Committee has reviewed our financial statements (which show income and expenses balanced), passed a budget for the year, reviewed our annual audit and

approved a grant request to the Diocese for 2018 (for the same amount as this year). I've updated them on a number of property questions, and at our next meeting we plan to review a proposed set of by-laws to clarify how members are elected and decisions are made.

If you have any questions about the business of the church, especially finances and property, feel free to speak with one of the Bishop's Committee members. If they don't know the answer to your question I'll help them find it as soon as possible. Many thanks to Forrest, Kathleen and Raycita for joining Greg and Carleen on this important group!
