## A Special Christmas

The first thing that made Christmas special this year at St. Elizabeth's happened in the middle of November. Led by our Bishop's Committee we invited the whole community for a festive Holiday Meal. Everyone at the church pitched in to bake turkeys and pies, make side dishes and decorate, serve and clean up. We planned for a hundred people but there were more—they all had a good time and there was food left over!

Last winter the Poowegup girls collected \$80 in coins, the beginning of their Children's Offering which has made such an impact in the community (like paying the costs of the Holiday Meal). This year their coins added up to \$120, which after being matched by the church bought Walmart gift cards for two local families and an elder in the nursing home. Giving those early Christmas presents meant a lot to all of us.



That Spirit carried over into preparing for Christmas. On the second Sunday of December about twenty people made quick work of putting up decorations in the sanctuary and parish hall. Everything looked great and there was plenty of time to add the finishing touches. Kids got interested in the Pageant and Becca Gardner organized the teenaged narrators.

Christmas Eve was a wonderful celebration. Kids arrived more than an hour early to pick out their costumes, and the parish hall was bustling with activity before the service. The church was packed with old friends and the young people put on a wonderful Pageant. It seemed like we had Communion twice: once in the sanctuary and then again in the parish hall. The food was

terrific and Santa arrived with gifts for the kids.

What makes Christmas special? Festive decorations, Silent Night by candlelight and the church family gathered together for a meal are all wonderful. But there's nothing like seeing the Christmas story come to life, being part of bringing that Spirit to the whole community. Thanks be to God for St. Elizabeth's!
